Mytinger Project Signs Contract with Renowned Literary Agency, Partners with Writer Barbara Sleeper

SEATTLE, WA.—Michele Benoy Westmorland and Karen Huntt, principals and managers of Mytinger Project LLC, are happy to announce their recent official collaboration with The Writer's House, a New York literary agency. Al Zuckerman, who founded the agency 30 years ago, is working directly with the women to find a publisher and develop a coffee-table type book which will recount their two-month expedition to Papua New Guinea and the Solomon Islands in 2005. The book will include their photographs, and will also tell the story of artist Caroline Mytinger who inspired the expedition. It will showcase Mytinger's extraordinary paintings and sketches from her own four-year journey to the region in the late 1920s. One of the largest literary agencies in the world, The Writers House represents well-known and respected novelists and non-fiction authors such as Ken Follett and Stephen Hawking.

In related news, Benoy Westmorland and Huntt have retained the services of author Barbara Sleeper to assist them in developing text for the book. Barbara Sleeper's career as a science writer has spanned more than thirty years, during which time she traveled to more than 80 countries. Her more than 300 wildlife and travel articles have appeared in numerous national and international publications, including Audubon, Travel & Leisure, Travel Holiday, and Ranger Rick among many others. She has worked with photographer Art Wolfe and previously with Benoy Westmorland. Ms. Sleeper holds degrees in zoology and psychology from the University of Washington, where she earned her Master's degree.

Financial and in-kind contributions, tax-deductible under IRS regulations, are still being solicited. The project must raise an additional \$500,000 for documentary post-production expenses.
